SoCalGas Response 1:

- a. In 2017, SoCalGas hired four project advisors to support the leak inventory reduction project. Given that these positions were new and therefore not part of the Base Year 2016 costs, SoCalGas added the associated O&M costs to its forecast as an incremental increase. At the time the forecast was developed, SoCalGas projected 3.5 Project Advisors at an average expense of \$85,000 per FTE.
- b. Please see the corresponding expenses for the number of project advisors below. There were no associated expenses from 2012 2016 as these are new positions added to address the leak inventory reduction effort, as explained on Page GOM-78, lines 20-26.
